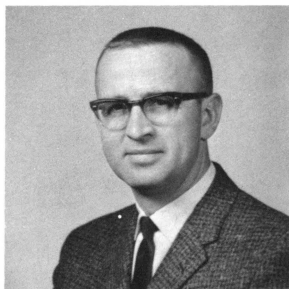
AUTO MECHANICS

Students in Auto Mechanics acquire a full knowledge of the operation of a car and are taught the use of special tools and equipment.

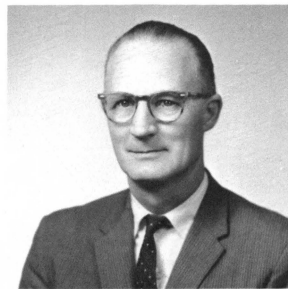

The purpose of the Business Department is to train students to be efficient and accurate and able to meet the challenge of the Business World.



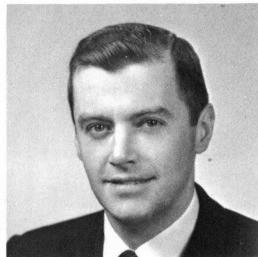

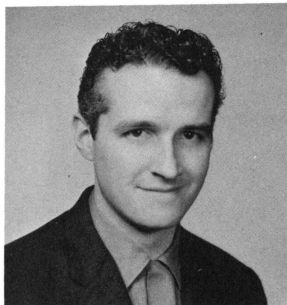
PATTERNMAKING AND CABINETMAKING

Another branch of this field is Patternmaking, where students design patterns for metal objects out of wood, metal, plaster, or plastics.



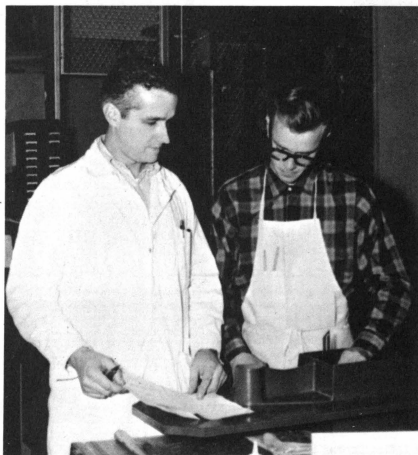

Shoe Repair students are taught how to repair shoes by hand and by machine. Their training enables them to work in a shoe repair shop or start a business of their own.

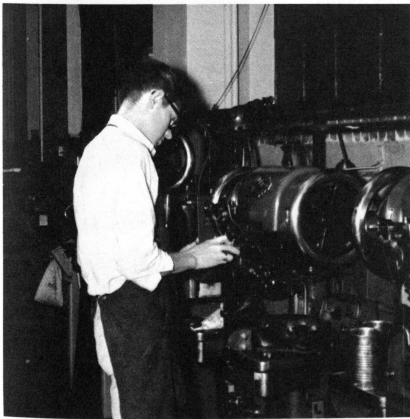

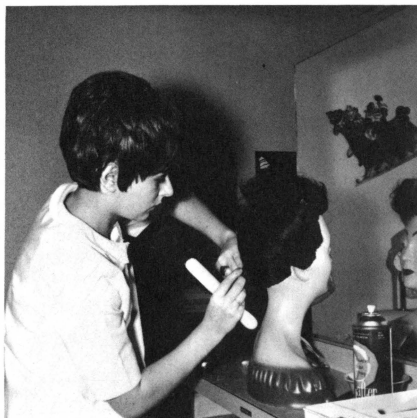

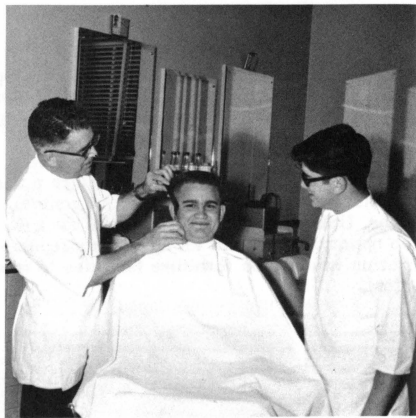

A career in Cosmetology offers a challenge to students with creative talent. This department can compete on an equal basis with any beauty salon in the city. Upon completion of the 1500 hour course, seniors must pass the State Board Exams, after which they receive their license and are ready for employment.

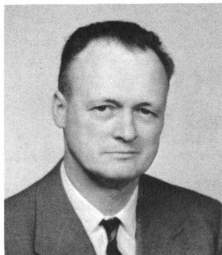

The Sheet Metal Class offers training not only in the installation and making of sheet metal parts, but also in the manufacturing end of the business.

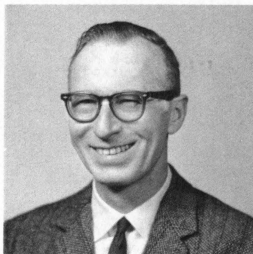

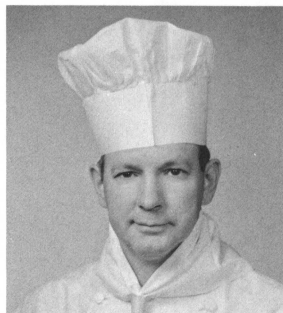


RESTAURANT TRAINING

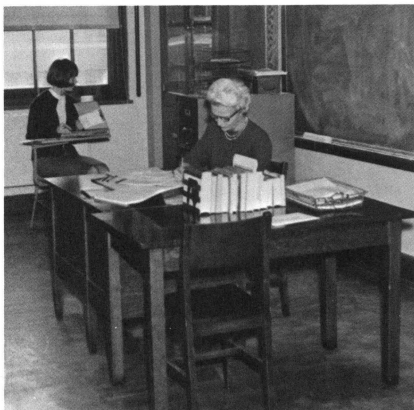

The English Department offers a three-year course in English. Two years of standard English are taught with a variation of drama, journalism, or yearbook in the senior year.

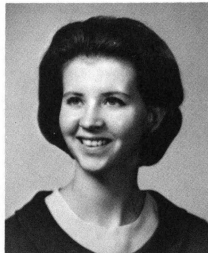

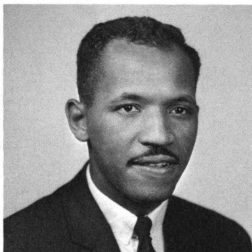
There are various Mathematics courses designed to meet the needs of all trades.

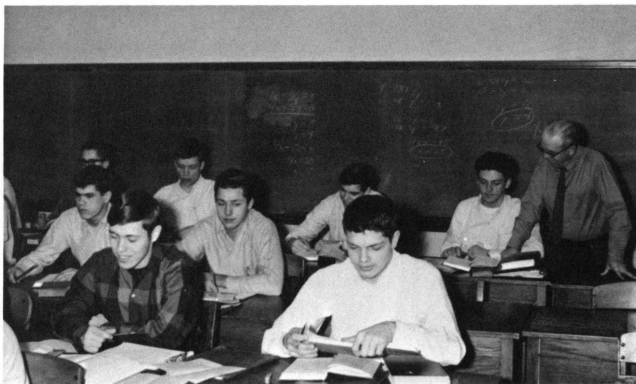

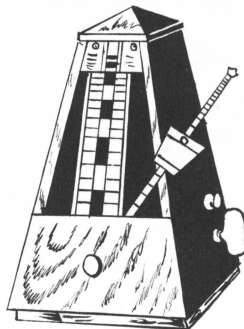

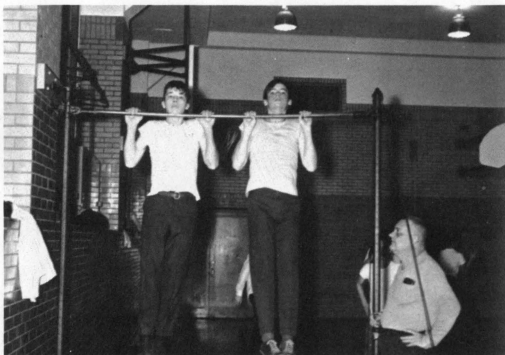
Physical Education is offered to students in their first year only. This course is a good way to burn up extra energy and offers a relaxing break in the daily routine of classes.

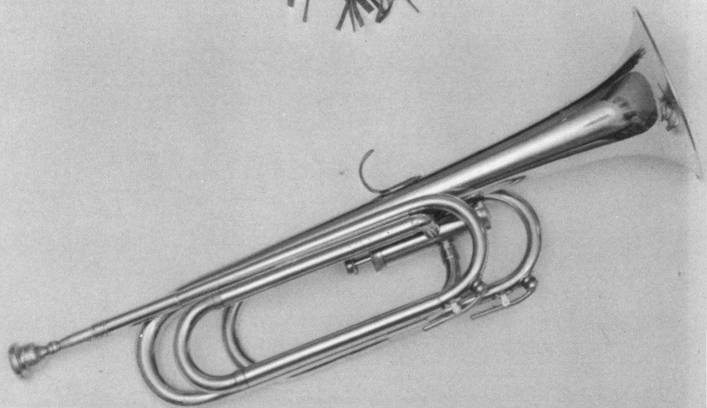
The students are trained under ordinary shop procedures, and at the same time are producing five to seven million copies a year. There are five tradesmen in the shop, four journeymen and one apprentice.

Placements in this field are so high that many students with ability are able to go out on co-op. Some former students even own their own Graphic Arts Shop.

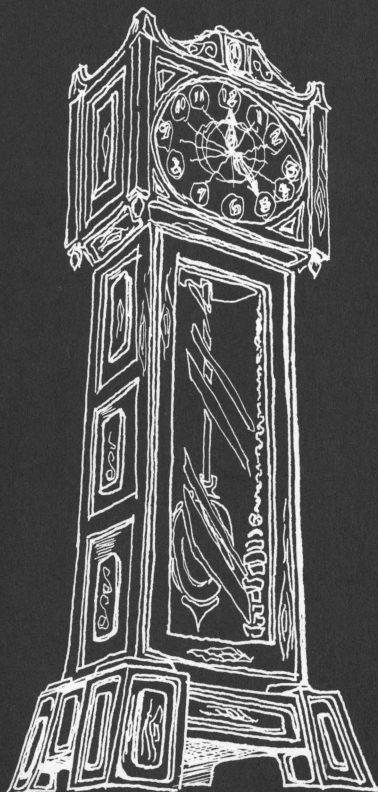

The beautifully decorated gym was filled for the victory dance that evening; and dancing was made livelier with the beat of the Deacons.

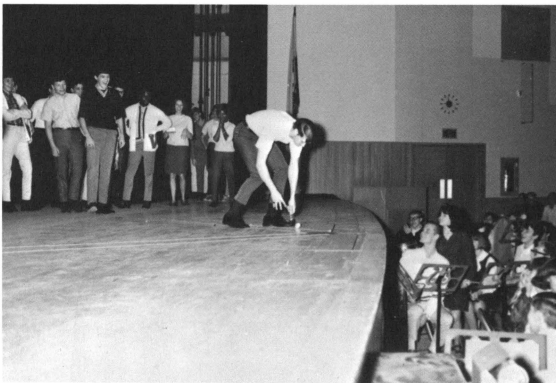

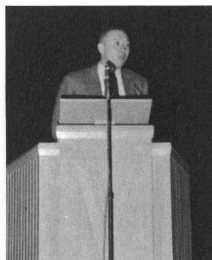
CROSS COUNTRY

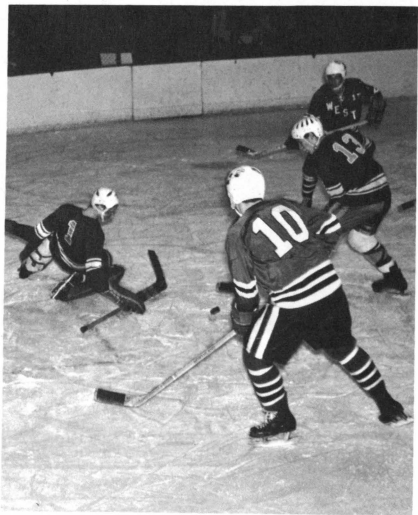

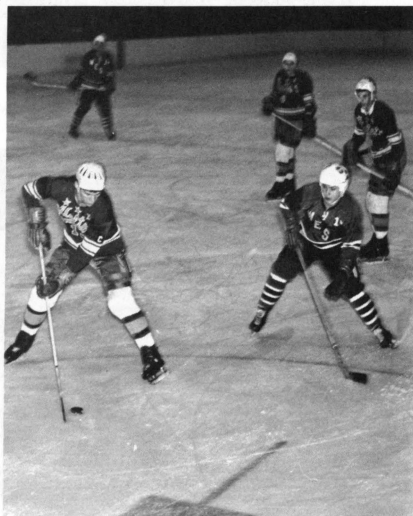
